Abstract

This panel explores various donor and recipient motivations for foreign aid, as well as the differences between official and humanitarian aid. It questions the “humanitarianity” of humanitarian aid, examining differences between donors, timing of aid and purpose-to-end relationships. At the same time, the panel aims to discuss the various internal impacts of aid within recipient (but also donor) states. Considering all the above, the panel particularly invites paper proposals that empirically examine whether and how foreign aid influences internal and regional stability, meets the donors' and recipients' expectations and engages with existing internal and international political processes. Although we are particularly interested in papers that address the connection between foreign economic and strategic involvement and political stability (internal, regional and global) we also welcome papers on social cohesion and social resilience in general.
