We've made a decision for our events to take place within the walls of our member institutions, often with receptions in the civic spaces of the host city, rather than in anonymous convention centres.


Hosting an ECPR event is an opportunity for you to showcase the very best your institution and your city has to offer, so that participants get a sense of the history and character of the place

they are visiting, as an intrinsic element of their conference experience.

Almost by definition, universities tend to exist in towns and cities with an ample cultural offering. Recent ECPR events have been hosted by institutions in such attractive destinations as Prague, Reykjavik, Oslo (pictured), Pisa and Budapest.

A chance to experience the sights, sounds and tastes of the host city alongside people who share your scholarly interests – and perhaps to strike up new friendships in a memorable setting – means that a trip to an ECPR conference can turn into something so much more than just an academic event.

'Positioning the University of Tartu in a national and international arena was my own personal incentive to host the 2016 Graduate Student Conference.

Another benefit of hosting an ECPR event is that the cooperative balance between ECPR and the host institution is just right, Goldilocks style!

For example, ECPR takes on the academic role – choosing papers, doing the cross-national logistics, international promotion, etc – all of which would be hugely disincentivising for a local organiser if they had to do it alone.

'Hosting a big event such as the ECPR General Conference certainly helped us foster links with academic institutions abroad.

Apart from chairing two roundtables, many of my colleagues put together panels, and in this sense, I believe it gave us, as an institution and as researchers from East-Central Europe, some confidence.

What is more, I believe it strengthened our position within the University – being an institution with three medical faculties and with very rich faculties such as mathematics and biology, social science disciplines have been perceived as the weaker link.

So again, organising such a conference, bringing so many people to Prague, and putting together special issues for the occasion, enabled us to be more visible – and show that we do research; research that has a place in the European arena.

We hope to utilise this experience as we apply for more institutional grants, and expand as an institution.

In any case, it was a wonderful experience – some of my colleagues think I am crazy, but I would certainly do it again, if I had the chance!'



Become an ECPR Member if you are not already signed up

Provide spaces big enough to accommodate participants (see next page for figures)

Ensure all rooms are equipped with appropriate AV, including classrooms / panel rooms, lecture hall/s, IT room, breakout spaces

Arrange social events, including a welcome plenary session and reception, along with speakers for the keynote lecture and roundtable events, if relevant

Manage cost-efficient on-site catering in concert with ECPR

Liaise with hotels and transport providers, in the local language if relevant, to ensure up-to-

date information is provided in the event run-up

Supply ECPR with information from which we can produce the print & online programme, to an agreed schedule

Engage the services of reliable English-speaking student helpers **Secure** sponsorship from local businesses to keep registration costs to a minimum (if relevant)
